

















Barrett Township Historical Society

The Barrett Township Historical Society celebrated our 30th Anniversary in 2023. We have operated the Cresco Station Museum since 1999, housed in the circa 1880's Cresco Station built by the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad. In 2018, we opened the Library and Research Center across the street from the station, in a building built in 1928 for the Cresco Post Office. The Weiler family Foundation very kindly leases both buildings for our use. The station is on Sand Spring Road.
